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Choose from one of five tracks.

Track 1: Regalim Modes Master Class with Cantor Jaclyn Chernett

This track will take you to a deeper level of understanding the musical modes as they impact upon the text of our Festival services. Advanced level.

Track 2: Hallel with Cantor Stephen Cotsen

Hallel – Psalms 113-118 – is sung in our Festival services and at the Pesach Seder. Come and learn the appropriate melody for the blessing and some of the joyous melodies. For all levels.

Track 3: Pesukei d'Zimra with Cantor Norman Cohen Falah

Shabbat, Pesach, Shavuot and Sukkot all share the same nusach (chant melodies) for Pesukei d'Zimra, the opening to the morning services. This track is for beginners and for more experienced leaders who may not have had formal training in the specific melodies for Shabbat and Festivals.

Track 4: Siddur SatNav with Rina Wolfson

Back by popular demand (with new material for those who participated last time), this track is perfect if you want to be able to pick up any prayerbook and instantly find what you're looking for. No knowledge of Hebrew is needed. You'll be following the service in no time.

Track 5: Child Friendly Services with Marc Shoffren

How can we involve children in adult services, while enhancing prayer-activities specifically for children? This track will focus on what makes a difference to children's prayer, and how to nurture children's spirituality in adult- as well as child-focused settings. For organisers of adult services as well as children's service leaders.

The Art of Shulmanship seminar is designed to enhance awareness and understanding and to whet the appetite for more. You can come into the programme at any level and find something to learn. If you then want to extend your knowledge, EAJL (the European Academy for Jewish Liturgy) can help you achieve your dream by matching you with a mentor who will guide you.
