



A Statement of Values

This continues to be the most challenging of times for the people of Israel. My thoughts are with Noam and all those missing loved ones, now held hostage, those mourning, injured and serving. My thoughts are also with the innocent people of Gaza who face challenges that should disturb each of us, no matter how pained and angry we are at the attacks

perpetrated across the border from their home.

I've been honoured to have played a small role in the drafting of a statement of 'Our Jewish Values' with a number of Jewish leaders from across the denominational spectrum. Aside from giving me, and my co-signatories, now in their several hundreds, the opportunity to express our relationship with these awful times in the language of our faith, a statement like this is also intended for our non-Jewish friends and fellow citizens here. I'm grateful to Rabbis Charley Baginsky and Josh Levy for their leadership in bringing this work forward.

In other news, I was so moved to be able to share teaching, back in the Synagogue, on Wednesday night. We looked at the relationship of the Jews to the land of Israel. This Wednesday, at 7:30pm, again only in person, I'll be looking at our tradition's approach to Military Ethics, from the classic Halachic categories, to the pioneering work of Rav Shlomo Goren, first head of the Military Rabbinate of the Israel Defense Forces and pioneer and the IDF's own code of military ethics. Do please join me. I'll be sharing some insights into these approaches also on Shabbat.
